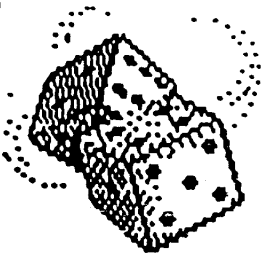

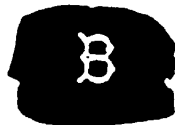

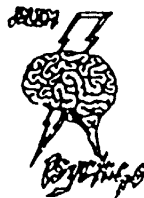

New England News

Some of you "Old Time" Fly By Night members may remember the Lake Erie Lime Sox entering the FBN by expansion two years ago with a three year plan. Year 1 was dedicated to acquiring enough offensive talent to be respectable in year 2. The goal for my second year is to make the team strong defensively up the middle without sacrificing any offense and trying to finish at .500 for the year.

As we wind down toward the end of the Lime Sox 2nd year, our record is 74-76 and we seem to be on target. The Lime Sox will open the 1988 season with Ernie Whitt behind the plate. Tony Fernandez and Marty Barrett will patrol the middle infield positions and Andy Van Slyke Willie McGee, and Dale Murphy will once again be New Englands Starting outfield. All are improvements defensively from the Lime Sox of 1986. JOHN Kruk and Larry Parrish will be at 1st and 3rd while Kevin Bass returns to the Lime Sox and should share DH duty with Don Baylor. Baylor along with Joe Cowley, Jim Dwyer, Ron Cey, and Jose Guzman are the only players originally drafted by the Lime Sox who are still with the team. Bass was originally with New England but was dealt to the Wallingford Twisters midway through the 1987 season and was reaquired by New England for the 1988 season.

Several team records have been broken this season and several others should fall before the seasons end. Marty Parrett has already broken Brett Butlers team record for doubles with 37 to Eutlers 34. Barrett also has 96 runs scored to Butlers 81 for the 86 Lime Sox. Larry Parrish has broken Ron Ceys record of 83 RBI's with 89 so far this season. Parrish also should break Ceys team home run record of 31. Parrish has 30 round trippers with 12 games left to play. Glen Davis has 38 HP's this year but only 23 were hit with New England. Willie McGee has been caught stealing 16 times this season which surpasses Butlers 13 CS in 86. Eutler also stole 53 bases in 86, more than double McGees output of 21 which leads the Lime Sox this season.

On the pitching side of things, Roger McDowell has appeared in 61 games thus far for NewEngland breaking Dave Smiths mark of 58. Bruce Hurst has 14 wins in 87, matching Rick Mahlers total in 86, while in the loss column, Bill Wegman's total of 16 equals that of John Denny and Al Nipper. Joe Cowley has walked 81 batters in only 111 IP breaking Dennys record of 71, while Hurst has broken his own strikeout record with 156 this season.

Phase three in the Lime Sox 3 yr plan will be to concentrate on pitching. We hope to do this with careful selections in the 1988 pre-season draft. The Lime Sox are looking for one quality starter and a Lefty stopper for next season, and young pitching prospects for 1989 and beyond.

Good Luck to those of you who make the playoffs. The Lime Sox hope to join you there next season.
