**SOME PLAYING PROBLEMS IN '87.** Playing face to face in '87 was a real dream for the NL East. We played over a hundred games face to face. By doing so we found out that the interpretation of the rules were not the same by all the managers. So during the last Shoot Out we came up with some rules to follow. These will be used by all mangers in 1988:

1. Reliever: POW. Is the same as a Starter. (Example: Todd Worrell POW is 2. In his second inning of work he is in his POW inning. ( Even if in inning one he only got one out the start of the next inning is the start of his POW inning.)

2. The sacrifice bunt chart is just that, a sacrifice. It can only be used with a runner on base.

3. Squeeze chart can be used with 2 outs! It is a play that can be used anytime a runner is on third.

## US JARHEADS Raise Flag in AL West (99-63)

US Jarheads capped the season with an incredible eleven game winning streak to nose out Munson's Marauders for the AL West title by virtue of a better head to head record (10-8).

The streak began with a face to face win vs. Munson's at Bruno's shootout when Bob Ajeda posted his 21st victory. That left 5 home games vs California and a 5 game road trip to Yorktown.

The home sweep of California combined good pitching and outstanding hitting for 4 easy wins and a final 1 run cliff hanger.

When the results of the final 5 games arrived from Yorktown bedlam broke out as they showed a 5 game Jarhead road sweep that tied Munson's at 99 wins which clinched the AL West.

The Jarhead bats carried the day as Brooks, Sox, O'Brien + Co. pounded the Admirals for 76 hits and 15 home runs for the second road sweep of the Admirals this year. (4-0 road sweep in June)

US Jarheads to move to new Ball Park in 1988.

The Jarheads finished the 1987 season in the old Cinn Suds ballpark to avoid confusion for other FBN managers who based their visiting pitching rotations on the distant fences of Suds Field.

Their new home will be Kate Elizabeth Park in Waterford Conn. Final construction is ~~not~~

not yet completed, however I can tell you that the fences will definitely be closer than Suds fields and it will be a natural grass field.

Rookie manager Neiman has yet to make a trade since taking over the team in June but that may change soon. We need pitching (starters) to pick up for 21 game winner Ojeda who will have less than 50 innings in '88. Pedro Guerrero maybe available for the right deal. We won without him in 87 (only 67 AB's) so he may be "shopped" around this winter.

US fanheads look forward to the move from the AL West to the NL East in 1988. You just can't beat the excitement of face to face games and we should have plenty of that with 5 Connecticut teams in the division.
