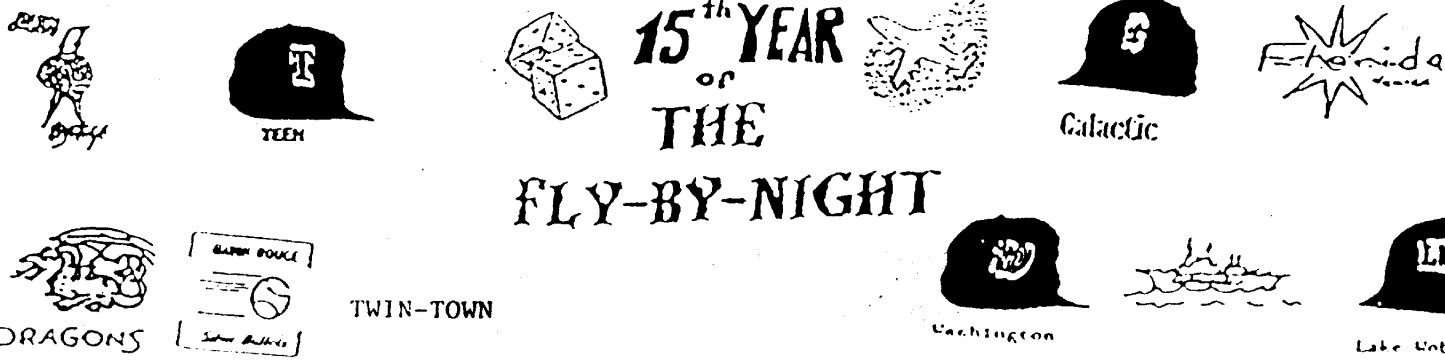

Team management expected to have a competitive pitching staff, but so far that hope has been unrealized. The hitting has also been a complete disaster. None of the "franchise" players has been earning his keep. All attempts to light a fire under the team have failed, so management decided to trade away unsuccessful newcomers Hurst and Bass. Mike Marshall and Rick Sutcliffe can't possibly be as bad - can they? It's time to start thinking about next year, I guess.

Notes from the Florida File: Manager Dick Williams was unavailable for comment last week, after Florida pitchers gave up 29 runs in the 3-game series against Lake Wobegon. The most serious blow, was in game 3, an 8-run 9th inning which dissipated a 7-3 Florida lead. A bases loaded Samuel Triple capped a 4-run bottom of the ninth rally, which tied the game at 11's. It took 14 frames for LW to score while Florida was held with hit over the final 5. After having leads in all three games, Florida came away from the series empty. Series 10 proved little better with Florida going 4-6 against Baton Rouge. Here the pitching was good, but the hitting fell. Florida scored a mere 33 runs in the 10 games. Finally breaking his silence Dick Williams was quoted as saying, "We Brought up our kids for the rest of the year. If we play .500 ball this year that will certainly be reaching our preseason goal. After all we have had a great change over since last year. At this time we were 7-37 and finished with 106 losses. That won't happen this year. Another trade possibility and a good draft will fill in the final holes we have." Sincerely Mike Gerack

TEEM: In the first 44 games, timely hitting and pitching has produced a 27-17 record for the team. The bullpen has made 85 appearances and is 10-5 with 13 saves. Eric Plunk the so called stopper has an ERA hovering around 5.00. The offense has been consistent. The team has hit .279 at home and .263 on the road. Strawberry leads the team in most offensive categories including 22 steals without being caught (make that 27, I just received more road stats). Speaking of steals, the team is 87 for 98 in stolen base attempts (51 for 59 on the road). Opponents have been successful 65 of 72 attempts including 28 of 29 at TEEM. Mattingly is off to an excellent (unexpected) start hitting .366. The biggest offensive surprise has been Greg Gagne (24 RBI) and Tim Paines (7 homers, 21 RBI). The biggest disappointment has been Robin Yount (.217). The biggest pitching surprise has been Mike Maddux (1.88 ERA in 24 games, mostly middle innings). The disappointments are Nolan Ryan (3-4) and Greg Swindell (3-5) despite decent ERA's. BRUCE
