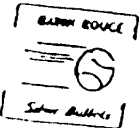

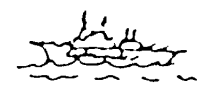

Jarhead Scuttlebutt: David Palmer earned a share of the Jarhead of the week award for the wnd record week in a row. He shared honors last week for his 13 inn. shutout of Willimantic. This week he was recognized for his record tying batting performance against Asylum. Playing as the DH, Palmer had a 5 hit game and drove in 5 runs to lead the Jarheads to a 14-6 win. The 5 hits in one game ties a record shared by C. Lansford ('87 vs Brunos Redskins? or Eagles? or 89-ers?) & S.Sax ('87 vs Yorktown). Palmer followed up that performance with a pinch hit 8 inn. 2 run single to give the Jarheads a 1 run win over Willimantic. Since being recalled, Palmer has a 3-1 record and is hitting .500 on 9 for 18 with 8 RBI. Palmer shared this weeks award with Sid Fernandez. Fernandez was bumped out of the starting rotation for one start against the Lime Sox Because he hadn't gone more than 4 innings in his previous 3 starts. He had a 2-7 record with an ERA of 7.58. After missing one start and then being placed back in the rotation "El Cid" has been awesome. In 2 face to face encounters; he first shut out Asylum on a two hitter (8K) and followed that with a 4 hitter (11K) shutout of Willimantic. The back to back shutouts lowered (?) his ERA to 5.52 Raphael "Harmon" Ramirez is making it difficult for Water Weiss to crack the starting lineup. Ramirez is hitting .336 on 49 for 146 with 7D 1T and 8 HR's. Steve Bedrosian and Jerry Gleaton have moved Tom Henke out of his "closer" role with the jarheads. They have combined for a 3-1 record with 13 saves and a 1.57 ERA. Henke meanwhile has a 3-2 record with 2 saves and has been hammered to the tune of a 6.39 ERA. Since moving to middle relief Henke has ahown some improvement and has picked up 2 of his 3 wins. Steve Sax has stolen 21 bases out of 23 attempts. Last years Jarhead homerun leader Carney Lansford (31 HR) hit his first homerun this year after 196 AB.

Devil Doodles: Connecticut is in the midst of a 9 game win striak (12 of last 15) which has surged them to 17 games over .500 at 43-26!! After splitting a 10 game face to face series vs defending FBN Champions Pawcatuck, the Blue Devils then won 7 of 10 (FTF) vs the 89ers and swept a big 5 game home series vs Topeka Liggins!! Marvell Wynne has been the hottedt of late batting .352 in his last 20 games with 6 doubles, 3 triples and a HR raising his average from .179 to .259!! The Blue Devil pitching staff tossed 3 shutouts in the series vs Allyn Street with Mark Gubicza leading the way - 16 innings - 2 runs - 9 hits - 5 walks and 13 K's - 2-0 record! Hometown rookie Rob Dibble continues to be impressive. He has a 1.24 ERA in 29 innings allowing just 12 hits with 24 K's!! Finally, "Lady Luck" smiled on Connecticut in their recent series vs Topeka. The Blue Devils won 3 games in their final at bat! (2 in extra innings) RJ Reynolds led off the 10th with a HR off John Franco in game 2.
