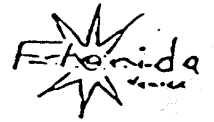

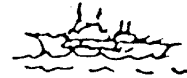

INSIDE THE F-B-NBA

N. L. National League US Jarhead Scuttlebutt: The Jarheads moved to 20 games over .500 (52-32) by winning both the home and away series versus the CT Blue Devils 3 games to 2, in a marathon face to face meeting.

At Connecticut, USJ won the "rubber" game when Danny Jackson (13-6) halted a personal 3 game losing streak by pitching his first shutout of the year, a three hitter. In two previous starts at Kate Elizabeth Park, Jackson was hammered by CT, giving up 21 hits in 12.2 innings. These 2 series featured 4 shutouts, three by Jarhead pitchers, including Sid Fernandez (5-8 4.58) who fired a 3 hitter (9K) for his 3rd consecutive shutout!

In the three "El Cid" has given up 8 hits in 27IP with 28K. His streak ended in the first inning of his next start at CT, when Guerrero booted a ground ball and 2 unearned runs scored. Fernandez took the loss 3-1 as Kilgus held USJ to 1 run on 5 hits. The other Jarhead shutout was a 6 hitter by Bob Djeda (9-3). Djeda fanned nine in recording his second shutout of the year.

The Jarheads hit only .226 for the 10 games, BUT... David Palmer (4-2) continued his assault on NL West Pitching. In the home 'rubber' game at Kate Elizabeth Park, Palmer (playing as the DH) homered and doubled off Paul Kilgus, driving in 4 runs in an 8-6 USJ win. Palmer is now hitting .481 on 13 for 27 with 2D, a homerun, 12 RBI and 8 runs scored.

When the jarheads meet Glen Boucher's Hawks, it will complete a 50 game face to face encounter with the NL West. After 40 games in the West, USJ is 24-16.

Tracy Jones not only is hittion well (.357 on 41/115), but has 18 stolen bases without being caught. Steve Sax leads USJ in SB with 24-2.

Devil Doodles: For this report - a Break from statistics and a look at some history. The Blue Devil franchise originally began back in 1975 as a team called the "West Jeff Jerks" in Ohio managed by present Yorktown manager Jeff Merklin. The "Jerks" were FB NBA Champions in 1975 but then hit hard times finishing in last place for 4 straight years. The team moved to Holland Michigan in 1984 with an overall 590-706 .455 record. As the "holland Hawkmen" for 3 years they compiled a 217-267 record finishing last in 1984 but rebounding to first place in 1985. At the end of the 1986 season a new owner bought and moved the team to Connecticut installing Lou Piniella as field manager. In Connecticut the Blue Devils have found consistent success - winning their division in 1987 and 1988 with 96-66 and 97-65 records, respectively and are presently in a tough battle for first again. The team has changed dramatically in the past 3 years as only 4 members of the 1986 team remain - Orel Hershiser, Mark Gubicza, Tim Wallach and Dick Schofield. All other present team members have been draft picks or part of trades. The current roster has an average age of 26.4 years old with the entire pitching staff 27 years old or younger (except Hershiser who is 30). Things are looking good for the future as well as the present!!

Career Notes: Tony Gwynn is 1 hit away from 500 hits as a Blue Devil in only 360 games!! Yougster Will Clark is on a pace for 157 strikeouts this season which would obliterate the current team record of 110 by Tim Wallach in 1988.

Player Moves: Alan Ashby & Jeff Blauser are called up from the minors - sent down are Cecil Fielder & Kirt Manwaring.

Also, with Inky low on at-bats, veteran Tony Armas was acquired to supply some extra crunch vs lefties and give Incaviglia a braeak. To make room
