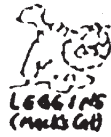

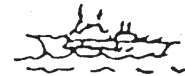

New England News In our 4th Season in the FBN the Lime Sox have finally made the playoffs!! An expansion team 4 years ago New England has shown steady progress and we have finally made it to the top.

New England began with a last place finish at 67-95 in 1986. The Lime Sox improved to 3rd at 79-83 and we were 3rd in our division last season once again despite improving our record to 88-71. Our perseason goal was two fold; win 90 games and make the playoffs and we accomplished both.

Several team records and major firsts were achieved this season. We have our 1st 20 game winner: Greg Maddux finished the year with a 21-13 record (16-8 with New England) Jose Guzman's 3 shutouts is a team record. Also Rob Deer set a team record with 42 HR's. Deer's 115 RBI is also a team record.

The Dragons finished their fifth season with their worst record: 64-98. The previous low was 79-83 mark in 1986. Joe Carter was the team's MVP, hitting 25 homers and driving in 105 runs. The team as a whole hit only .257 after compiling a .276 average in the previous 4 seasons. The defense was tighter than ever, Making only 97 errors after averaging 111 per season. Ripken and

Doran combined for 21 errors - not bad!

As usual, the starting pitching was dismal. The seven starters went 39-81 with an ERA of 5.14. The 5 main relievers, on the other hand, were 25-17 with an ERA of 2.73. Howell got off to a fast start in saves but finished with only 13. There was no clear Cy Young candidate. Mark Davis participated in the most wins (10 wins and 11 saves), but lost 9 games. Howell was in 16 wins (3 wins, 13 saves) and only 2 losses; however, he only pitched 52 2/3 innings. His 1.71 ERA was second only to Agosto's 1.65. He was given the team's Cy Young award by default.

Tradewinds: The team's six untouchables (Carter, Ripken, Doran, Lavalliere, Mark Davis and Howell) are no longer unavailable. Management will listen to offers for anyone on the team. Of course, it will take a really good offer to get any of those six players. The Dragons need starting pitching and a lead-off man, preferably a left fielder.

Hilltopper Highlights Though the last quarter season's performance was impressive; the Hilltopper management entered the off-season with a definite list of long term needs such as:

- a) One or two everyday outfielders to relieve the log jam of platoon artists who limited Manager Joe Schultz's flexibility at other positions.
- b) A starting pitcher to provide insurance in case Eric Show doesn't return to form.
- c) A shortstop for the eventual replacement of Spike Owen and Raf Belliard.
- d) A catcher to eventually replace the aging but still productive Mike Heath and Tony Pena.
- e) A reliever or two to accommodate normal bullpen volatility.

"We're not going to do anything rash", explained Chief Concessionaire Tip D. Waiter, "With 8 picks in the first 4 rounds we're going to have our grubby hands all over a lot of talent in the draft this winter."

** The same optimism promoted GM and Owner-for-Life Klee to unveil next year's slogan for Klee's Klubber's: "Ninety in Ninety!" This year's slogan, "Come to the Ballpark, Mom - Please" wasn't particularly inspiring.

Allyn Street A'st wasn't as good as they appeared during Tommy Lasarda's first 6 games (5-1), nor as bad as they looked against the Pequots at the end of the season (0-6). 1Strengths:0 Its taken only one full season to see that the 89ers have one of the best firstbasemen in Fred McGriff. McGriff hit 34 Homeruns and drove in 100 RBI while batting .263. His '89 MLB stats will only make him improve for the 89ers. Fleet footed Cecil Espy is a prototype to the 89ers NEW stadium (fans thought OLD Yankee Stadium had a "Death Valley") Espy was second on the 89ers in steals in '89 with 33, while playing in a limited roll. He will get more time in '90, as the starting centerfielder. Complementing the speedy Espy will be leftfeilder Dan Gladden. Even at age 33, Gladden showed the Twins he can steal a base or two. Cris James rounds out the outfield in right. James has decent power and he should give McGriff some help in the HR department. Finally, 89er Rookie Ricky Jordan will have a years experience under his belt in '90. Those extra AB's will come in handy next year. 1Weaknesses:0 Vance Law had a terrible MLB season in '89. That's going to hurt the 89ers next year. Wally Backman did the same. The MLB DL in 1989 all but killed the 89er starting pitching for '90. Gooden, Robinson, Boyd, Youmans & Freeman all saw time on the DL. Beyond our weak second-line starting pitching the 89ers have solved our bullpen problems. Lester Lancaster, Duane Ward, Gene Nelson, & Ed Nunez give Lasarda four good arms to go to with the game on the line. (Steve Farr started his second game today for KC. I hope Harrold Richman is keeping watch!) 1Newfaces:0 Mackey Sasser and Pat Borders will share the catching duties in '90. But, GM Bruno would like to see them both get more AB's in the ML's next year. Fred Manreque who came over from Washington in '89, will be the starting second baseman. Manrique is batting around .300 in MLB. 1Management:0 Owner-GM Bruno feels trades can be made over the winter for help.

 "We're looking for a catcher an outfielder and a starting pitcher for '90. We will not do anything rash because of the tough division we are in. The 89ers are also happy with the job Lasarda did in the final days of the season. Outlook:0 The 89ers have improved for the '90, season but we are in the best division in the FBNBA. TOPEKA TIT BITS: The 1989 FBNBA season has mercifully ended for the Topeka Leggins with the midwesterners going 62-100, .383 and losing 100 games for the second consecutive season. (our first full season in the FBN league) While our draft looked to be pretty good, injuries have definitely hurt the process we had hoped to make for the 1990 campaign, so once again we will be lucky to make the so far unreachable mark of .500 baseball. Gary Sheffield, our 1st round selection, broke

his leg and came up with attitude problems that led to his being sent to AAA. Eric Hanson had arm/shoulder problems for most of the season, but he has come back strong and should help in '91. Rob Ducey hurt his leg early, and the 'Jays discovered Junior Felix in his absence. Cito Gaston has given Lloyd Moseby a 2nd chance, so Ducey is now cast in a reserve roll. I still like his chances, although I don't know how he fits in--in Toronto. My best pick has turned out to be catcher Brian Harper. Harper has been above .300 most of the 2nd half and could push Allenson to a part time roll on the '90 version of Topeka Leggins. All in all I like the way I was able to draft, but I don't like my luck--or lack thereof--in the injury department?! The 1989 FBN campaign was a learning experience for me. I'm in 7 different PBM leagues, and they are all as different as day and night. Each draft is different and the way games are played are different. I'm especially happy at the way Rob has run the FBNBA. Very timely--with penalties to those late--as it should be!!! I look forward to the '90 season, although I fear that 90 losses (especially with the year long vacation of my pitching staff) is a distinct possibility. My limited 1989 FBNBA highlight film will feature two main characters: firstbaseman Andres Galarraga and RHSP & knuckleballer Charlie Hough and puff. Andres the Giant lead my team in the following categories: 162 G, 655 AB, 89 R, 191 H, 106 RBI, 51 2b, 12 3b, 27 HR, 177 K, .292 BA and 17 GWRBI. His 20 errors, despite being a "1" at 1b were only good enough for 2nd place behind SS Alfredo Griffin. Other offensive leaders include Robby Thompson (51 bb and 5 hbp), Dale "no can do RHPing" Murphy (14 hidp), Lenny Dykstra (46 of 60 sbs) and Alfredo Griffin. (27 sac & 21 errors) Hough led the pitching staff: 12-16, .429 pct, 12 cg, 256.2 IP, 3.61 era (best for eligible starting hurlers), and 169 K. John Franco had 22 saves despite a late season slump that saw him give up 63 h in 55.1 IP for and ERA of 3.58. Reliever Greg "2 Teams" Harris led in appearances (60), winning pct (9-7, .563) and RPIg ERA of 1.82. He only gave up 67 H and 6 HR in 104 IP. Bob Walk led with 36 GS and tied in shutouts (3) with Andy Hawkins. Walk (10-15, 4.21) and Hawkins (10-14, 3.98) combined with John Farrell (7-18, 4.31) in what turned out to be an extremely disappointing pitching staff that had an over-all ERA of 3.70. Our weak O hit only .250 and were outhit by opponents by 105 H. We drew only 418 walks compared to a pitching staff that gave up 604--thanks to Hough's 151 and Hawkin's 101. We were equally bad at home (31-50, .383) as we

were on the road (31-50, .383)--so we were at least able to claim consistency... I'm guessing that we will have one of the first 5 draft picks. Our needs are many with starting pitching becoming a top priority. Paul O'Neill's injury cost him a career season with the Reds, but he will be platooned with Dale Murphy in RF. George Bell will take his "4" to LF with some assistance from Dion James, while Dykstra will be in CF. Good luck to all you playoff teams!!! *Macl*

US Jarheads Scuttlebutt:

US Jarheads failed to make the playoffs despite winning 96 games! After a sub .500, 4th place finish in 1988 the Jarheads made tremendous progress finishing 30 games over .500 in '89, but neither fans or the players gained much satisfaction. Cy Young candidate Danny Jackson (24-11) summed up what fans and players alike are feeling. "Its going to be difficult to win over 95 games in this division next year. We gave it all we had this year and still couldn't catch Mystic and Pawcatuck." But owner, G.M. and manager Bill Nieman was still confident and saw plenty to be optimistic about. "Hey, we were in it all year and just fell short. We drew over 2 million fans and Kate Elizabeth Park was rocking all year. Last year they played "Taps" over us on July 4th, and the clubhouse was like a snake pit."

1989 saw a more cohesive team spirit with only one notable altercation which occurred after a tough mid season loss to Klee's Asylum. Mark Williamson pitched his only decent game of the year and took a 1-0 shutout into the top of the 9th inning. Two quick outs put USJ on the verge of victory. On what should have been the 3rd out, Pete OBrien booted a slow roller ala Bill Buckner. A shaken Williamson then loaded the bases on a double by Santiago and a walk to Jolt'n Spike Owen who was 2 for 29 in the 9 previous USJ games. Said Nieman, "Owen has 4 hits in 79 games, and then goes on a 2 for 29 tear against us....I know he was hot, but Williamson has to throw him strikes....so I gave him the hook."

Gleaton came on and had to face pinch hitter Heath who slapped a two run single, which stood up for a 2-1 Asylum win. As Williamson left the mound he was fuming and spitting at OBrien for his error and his failure to hit with men on base in the 1st, 5th, and 8th inning. When he reached the dugout, he continued screaming about being taken out when he was pitching a shutout. In the clubhouse, Williamson and OBrien started to scuffle again but Manager Nieman quelled the disturbance by punching out Williamson and OBrien and then making them shake hands.

"Ed Cid" or "little Sydney"??? Sid Fernandez (11-13, 3.85) established a Jarhead record for shutouts with 6 in 1989; three of them in consecutive starts. In games that he didn't pitch a shutout, Sidney was 5-13 with a 5.25 ERA.

US Jarheads were consistent at home and on the road in '89 going 49-32 at home and 47-34 on the road.

David Palmer saga draws to a close.... Dave Palmer's one year stint with the Jarheads will long be remembered around Kate Elizabeth Park. After being drafted as an emergency starter who didn't expect to see much action; Palmer got his break halfway into the season. He made the most of his opportunity and pitched a 13 inning complete game 6 hit shutout of Mendez' Willi Warriors. After going 1 for 2 as a pinch hitter Palmer was given a chance to DH vs the Asylum. He responded by tying a Jarhead record of 5 hits in one game (4 singles a double and 5 RB1.)

In the eighth LW finally got the lead by scoring two runs on four hits and a Whitaker error. Down 6-4 the Pequots came back with a run of their own in the eighth on consecutive singles by Greenwell, Evans and Lynn to cut the gap to 6-5. The Whippets stranded a man on third in the ninth setting up a dramatic bottom of the ninth. With Worrell pitching, Boggs led off with a single and was sacrificed to third Downing. Kirby Puckett then took Worrell deep on a 1-5, HR 1-13, 3 roll to give the Pequots the championship 4 games to 2.
