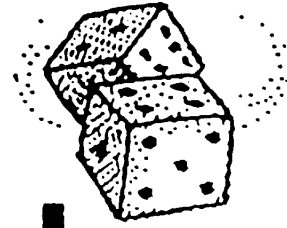

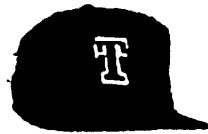

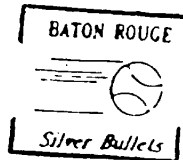

JARHEAD SCUTTLEBUTT:

The Jarheads gained a little revenge for an earlier drubbing by the Poquonock Chiefs. USJ hit .411 to take 3 of 4 from the Chiefs. Pedro Guerrero reached the century mark in RBI. With 36 games remaining Guerrero reached 100 RBI faster than any other Jarhead. Lonnie Smith is second on the team with 77RBI. Smith has the team lead in homeruns with 17 and has a chance for a unique accomplishment. He has a chance to reach both 100BB and 100 K's in the same season. With 96K's already, 100 is a certainty. His team leading 83 walks has him in striking distance of 100 BB also.
