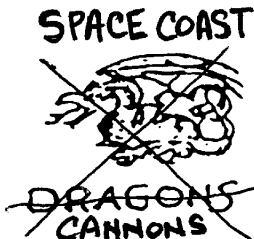

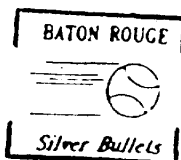

National League NEWS: The National League East ended in a tie between US Jarheads and Mystic Holstiens. The Jarheads had to sweep Mystic at home and take 2 out 3 from Pawcatuck to accomplish the tie. The Jarheads won the coin toss and won the home field advanage for the one game play-off. It was Candiotti vs. Saberhagen. The game was a nail bitter as Mystic had a 2-1, lead going into the 9th. USJ had runners on 2nd and 3rd in the bottom of the ninth but couldn't score. Mystic takes the NL East.

PLAYOFF NEWS: The National League Playoffs have started with Mystic playing USJ. In the first four games Mystic made nine errors but came away with a split. The remaining games will be played next week.

Windsor wins the NL West and Connecticut comes in second. Windsor with the highest winning percentage will play Connecticut in round one of the NLCS.

NATIONAL LEAGUE NEWSLETTER NOTES:

NINER NOTES - The 89ers finished out the season losing 2 of 3 to Pawcatuck 4-3 (lost), 2-1 (win) and 4-0 (lost). "Being shutout in the season finale was very poetic. All year this team couldn't do a thing! BUT, 1991 will be different !!", exclaimed coach Holowaty.

WARRIOR WAVES - Willimantic's hopes for a playoff berth went down the toilet when Pawcatuck and USJarheads took 4 out of 6 in each series. Pawcatuck stomped the Warriors 19-2 in game 5. Another mediocre year for the Warriors as their playoff hopes fade in the end.

Willimantic is looking for a CF who can leadoff. Give them a call if you have anything in mind for a trade.

PEQUOT POINTS - Wade Boggs needs 12 hits in his last 9 games to reach the 200 hit plateau. Can he do it????

KLUBBER KLIPS - The Klubbers closed out the season with an improbable four game sweep of AL powerhouse Galactic, clinching third place with an 83-79 record. It was the first winning season for the team and GM and Owner-for-Life Klee predicted many more: "I proclaim this franchise the Team of the Nineties. Pennants will fly from Jim Bouton Field from now until well into the next century!" Blue Devil owner Gineo was seen shaking his head, however, he offered no intelligible response.

Klee Mazzilli closed out his Klubber career with 3 long blasts against the Gladiators, giving him a .314 average, 10 HR, and 25 RBI's for the season in only 70 AB's!! Five of his dingers came in his last 17 AB's.

Klee was rather gracious in acknowledging Windsor's clinching of the NL West flag. "I know we've had our differences over the past year but I wish Mr. Boucher well in the playoffs. I'm sure the experience will help in his long recovery."

DEVIL DOODLES - Down the stretch, the Blue Devils failed to put pressure on the front-running Hawks and watched Windsor run away with the division. Connecticut split 2 big series vs. Lime Sox and Klubbers which, while ensuring a playoff spot for the 4th consecutive season, failed to provide a spark to a team which has treaded water most of the year.

Inconsistency again plagued Connecticut especially in the Lime Sox series where the Blue Devils scored 8 runs in each of their three wins but only one run in each loss. Rob Dibble lost his 12th game in relief vs. Klees but also raised his club record saves to 39! (5-12-39)

Luis Quinones continued to be impressive in platoon duty with 3 HR & 7 RBI's in 8 games raising his season totals to 19 HR and 53 RBI's in only 218 at bats and with only 52 hits!!

Another surprise has been the shortstop tandem of Jeff Blauser and Dick Schofield. They have combined to bat .260 with 70 runs scored and 92 RBI's!! Also, 36 doubles, 6 triples, and 12 HR's. Good production from the shortstop position. Rookie Omar Vizquel is waiting in the wings.

Devon White has reached a triple "double" with 21 doubles, 16 triples and 12 HR's while batting just .225. Tony Gwynn continues to lead the league in batting (.368) while scoring 115 runs and stealing 65 bases!! Finally, Mark Gubicza needs to win his final 2 starts for a 2nd consecutive 20 win season.
