## The G-Spot

At 23-6, the G-Men have lost one game in every series; no more, no less. We still have been in every game, now having lost 4 games by one run, and 2 games by 2 runs. While no one has tossed a complete game shutout, the staff has combined to throw 3 shutouts. We're sporting a 2.66 team ERA; not too shabby. Jaret Wright and Tom Gordon lead the way at 6-0, 1.04 ERA, and 3-0, 10 saves, 0.81 ERA, respectively.

In the hitting department, we've out-homered the bad-guys 39-21, despite having played only 10 home games thus far. We don't have anyone on a HR tear like Frank Thomas was last year, but we have 11 guys with at least 2 HRs, and 8 with 3 or more. Ronnie Belliard continues to tear things up with the bat, and is on pace for 86 doubles over the course of the year. Mark Kotsay has been the only disappointment, managing only a .234 average (.314 in real-life), although he does have 5 HRs.

## US Jarhead Scuttlebutt

Two rookie pitchers have been huge contributors to the Jarheads early season success. Fourth round draft pick Mike Wood, 2 -2, 2.10 and waiver wire pickup Andy Good, 2 -2, 3.66 lead the starting rotation in ERA. After 33 games USJ's total staff ERA stands at 3.32. How long can they keep it up???

## Psychic Vibes

What will be one of the longest seasons in Psychic's history continues to move along through block 2 with the team hovering around a .250 winning pct. While most of the regulars plod along in mediocrity, the future at least is being previewed well as the top 5 batting averages on the team, Lopez, Howard, Cantu, Swisher, and Mauer, were all drafted in the first 2 rounds of this year's draft.

Jose Lopez has been the real surprise offensively. Expected to struggle at the big-league level, he is 3rd on the team in RBI with only about 1/3 as many at bats as the regulars and is batting .395 with 10 extra base hits in just 43 at-bats. He made his presence known immediately upon call-up, doubling in each of his first 3 career at-bats.

The most disappointing player for Salem thus far has been Ken Harvey, who, after a good series vs. Hazardville, raised his average to a pathetic .138 in 109 AB's. The big man needs to show drastic improvement as the season goes on if he is to establish himself as the Psychics 1Bman for the foreseeable future as opposed to simply a placeholder for up and comers like Ryan Howard.

### Baton Rouge Notes:

The Silver Bullets have started yet another season in neutral, going 10-10 through the first round with 5 against Louisville outstanding. The AL East is very tough again, so 10-10 is not all that bad. We have had a few player who are off to a good start and some that have frost bite. Carlos Guillen leads almost every offensive category for the team - .362 average, 19 RBI, 5 home runs, 12 runs scored. Curt Schilling is 2-0 in 4 starts with a 2.08 ERA. Thome is off to the worst start any Bullet starter has ever had. He is hitting .091, with 1 home run. He does have 7 RBI most of which have come on walks with the bases loaded. Oliver Perez is 0-4 in 4 starts with a 9.25 ERA on 22 hits and 22 walks in 24 innings. This looks good compared to Reyes who has a 17.7 ERA - 9.2 innings, 19 hits, 14 walks, 17 earned runs, 22 total runs allowed.
