Voting Results, History repeated, last two items to vote on, 2009 Draft Order plus some league history.

Congratulations to the American League Manager of the Year – Ed Griffin.

Congratulations to the American League General Manager of the Year – Frank Simonutti.

In the National League one team ran away with all the awards. Not only did Burlington win the 2008 World Series but they just added to their trophy case as Roberto Clemente is named the National League Manager of the Year. To cap off a Triple Crown General Manager Bob Mendez, who put the players onto the roster for Clemente, was named the GM of the Year!

Congratulations to Bob Mendez for walking away with all three awards! This is only the second time in League History that this has been accomplished. The first time was in 1995 by Allyn Street 89ERS.

Twenty 22 members voted. Some did not vote for all items.

- 3b) unless he gives up 4 runs or he is tired or he is injured. 6 votes
- 3c) unless he gives up 5 runs or he is tired or he is injured. 2 votes

4. Should we add one of these exceptions to the rule. Yes ___7___ No ___6___

No matter if you voted yes or no please vote for one item below.

4a.) or in the 3rd, 4th or 5th (whichever passes in item 2) he has given up 2 runs and the 3rd run is in scoring position. **8 votes**

4b.) or in the 3rd, 4th or 5th (whichever passes in item 2) he has given up 3 runs and the 4th run is in scoring position. **8 votes**

4c.) or in the 3rd, 4th or 5th (whichever passes in item 2) he has given up 4 runs and the 5th run is in scoring position. **5 votes**

5. Should we add this exception to the rule: Yes ___7___ No ___15___

Exception: in the last block of the regular season only, a starter in his last start must pitch at least 3 innings unless he gives up (whatever number of runs that item #3 becomes) or (if we vote on item 4 that passes) or he is tired or he is injured.

6. All hitters with under 200 AB and pitchers with under 40 IP are limited to their actual AB or IP. Yes ___3___ No ___19___

7. All hitters with under 200 AB and pitchers with under 40 IP are limited to their actual AB or IP. All other hitters and pitchers are limited to 105% of their actual AB or IP. Yes ___2___ No ___20___

8. All batters with less than 100 AB would be further limited to 110% of the games played. So these players would be limited by 110% of both their AB and GP. Yes ___3___ No ___19___

9. We solicit someone to create and maintain a league file. Each trading period this league file will be updated to include roster changes for trades All games will be played using the updated league file, but there will be no requirement made to submit the results of games played. Yes ___10___ NO ___11___

10. Reduce the FBNBA 110% additional usage rule down to 105%. Yes ___9___ NO ___13___
