When you played a team at home your opponent also played your away games at the same time. Before the season started I traded Mike Smithson for Houston Jimenz. Looking back at here stats (Smithson 252 innings and he played five more seasons. Two good ones in ’85 and ’86.) Jimenz 298 at bats .201 average out of baseball for the next two years. Comes back in ’87 for 7 at bats and in ’88 for 22 at bats.) not very smart trade. I wanted a 2 at short. Never played the advance so didn’t realize 2e31 would hurt because to the errors. It was still better than my 4e8 at short. Yeah I know. I got hosed. lol

# THE FLY-BY-NIGHT BASEBALL ASSOCIATION

## Rules and Regulations

### I. Organization

A. The Fly-By-Night Baseball Association consists of 16 managers; 8 in the American League and 8 in the National League.

B. The American and National Leagues are divided into two divisions, the Eastern Division and the Western Division. Four teams are in each division.

C. The League is operated by the Commissioner, American League President and National League President.

### II. Commissioner's Duties

A. The Commissioner serves for life.

B. Impeachment may occur in the following manner.

1. Impeachment Vote can be called for only by a President and 4 or more managers.

2. Impeachment occurs when 2/3 (10 managers) vote to oust.

C. Election to office

1. Any Manager may run.

2. Majority of those voting needed to elect.

3. If more than 2 candidates and no one receives more than half of total votes, the top 2 vote-getters qualify for revote.

Duties of Commissioner are: (1)Scheduling of all types(games, playoffs, draft, etc.)--must consult with Presidents. (2)Player usage. (3)Treasurer. (4)Yearbook. (5)Monthly Newsletter. (6)Final Arbiter of Disputes/Constitutional interpretations--must consult with Presidents. (7)Division, League Alignments--must consult with Presidents. (8)Backup Manager Selection--with approval of at least one President. (9)New Manager Selection--with approval of appropriate President(whose league is affected). (10)World Series--plays Series unless personally involved or managers play face to face. If involved, Commissioner designates a neutral President to play Series. (11)Ballots--has power to call for a vote on any issue.

### III. Presidents duties.

A. Presidents serve for 2 years.

B. Impeachment may occur in the following manner.

1. Three managers of the Presidents League are required to bring matter to vote.

2. Impeachment occurs when 5 or more of that League's managers vote to oust.

C. Election of Presidents.

1. Anyone in same League may run.

2. Majority vote of same League managers are needed to elect.

D. Duties of Presidents are: (1)Each President handles own League stats. (2)Reports stats to Commissioner. (3)Reports League news to Commissioner for Newsletter & yearbook. (4)Oversees penalty points, League Play, Emergency Instructions. (5)advisor to Commissioner on schedules disputes, new managers, League alignments. (6)The 2 Presidents fill in for commissioner in emergencies that may incapacitate him/her. (7)League Playoffs--President plays unless personally involved or managers play face to face. Neutral manager plays if President and Commissioner are involved

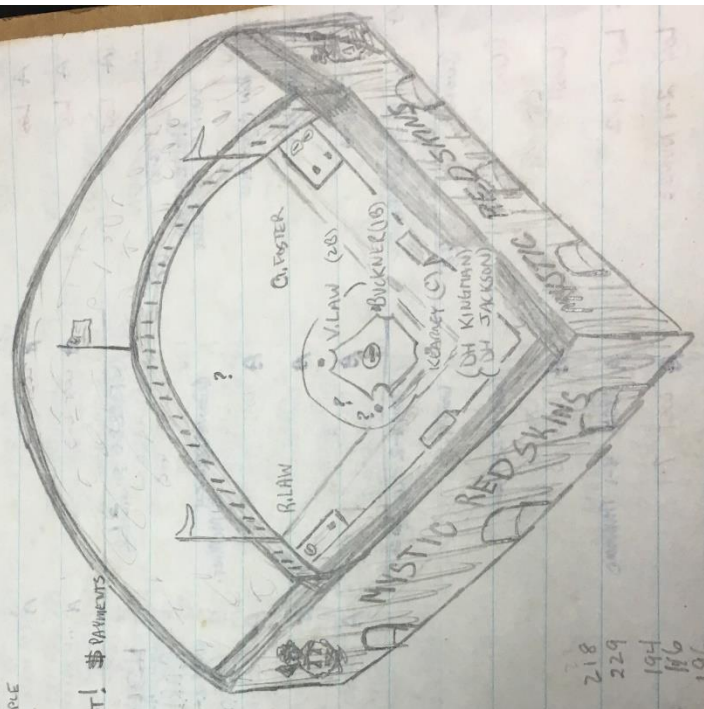
