HOW TO ADD CARD IMAGE:

1. Open the game.
2. Click on the current Fly-By-Night season.
3. On the Menu bar click on "Options".
4. Click on Dice/Cards/Splits.
5. On the right side of the screen under Card Image Options click the box "Show Cards in Notebook".

That's it. Now whenever you have a question about a batter or pitcher you just click on that player's name and the card will show up. Go Figure!

Allyn Street: “A win like this one can do wonders for a team's attitude. Everyone shares in the fun - the fans, the players, even you guy’s. It's better than winning by a dozen runs!” Casey Stengel’s response after a 6-5 win over Wall Street that earned the 89ERS a split in the series. In their next series the 89ERS took the first two from Illinois to match their longest winning streak (three games) of the season. But, the Prairie Dogs came back to take the last two games of the series. “Well you can’t win them all,” said Casey. “You can look that up.”



Taxachusetts is 9-3 to start Block 4, but trips to Maine, New England, and the U.S. Jarheads remain on the schedule. Who's Hot? LeMahieu .423 (22-52). Who's Not? Semien .163 (8-49) and Rizzo .178 (8-45). Other team notes: After three games were decided by one run, Chief bats come alive with five homers and a 3-run Murphy double to beat Hazardville 11-6. TX takes 3 of 4.

The Chiefs remain a game back of the Jarheads for First Place in the NL. The two teams have yet to schedule their series this block.
