American League:

Milford (84-19) continued on its winning ways going 7-1 again this week to build a 19 game lead over California (63-36). Both California, and New Hampshire (62-41) went 7-5, this week. Louisville (54-37) is in 4th place. Hotlanta (58-45) went 5-3 to remained in 5th place. Yorktown (49-46) went 9-3, to move into 6th place replacing Lake Wobegon. The Lake (52-51) went 9-11, since the last newsletter dropping to 7th.

National League:

A recent 4-8, run dropped the Jarheads (66-37) out of first place. Burlington (67-36) was on fire going 6-2, this past week to move 1 game in front of the Jarheads. Both teams have made trades to improve their bullpens effective Block 6. The Jarheads will add closer, Ryan Pressly and the Bucs went out and traded their #1DP to obtain Kirby Yates. Yates was rated the best closer in LBB coming into the 2020 season. Taxachusetts (63-40) went 6-6 and sit in 3rd place 4 games behind Burlington. Illinois (52-51) with a 12-8 run moved into 4th place. Connecticut (47-48) slipped to 5th.

THE BASEMENT BERTHA AND HER UGLY TWIN SISTERS AWARDS RACE:

At this writing it's four AL teams that have the lead for the first 4 picks of the 2021 draft. Atlanta 24-63, .276, Baton Rouge 34-61, .358, Arsenal and Urpaigh both at 36-59, .379. 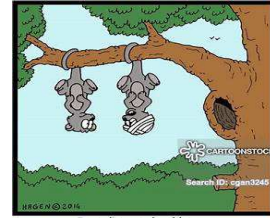

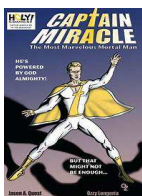

- Managers can send in All-Star candidates from your team. Please include the position you want to be listed for player on the ballot. List the player as DH or give him a position. For outfielders, just put OF since they can play all three OF positions. Send in Rookie of Year candidates from your team.

Nov 15-20 1. Voting on the issues to be completed by 8pm on November 25th. For 2020 it will include League items and it will include voting for all three League Officers.

Nov 30th - 1. GM's report their winter rosters to Bob Figella by 8pm.
