2024 World Series - Blue Grass Blues vs Connecticut Blue Devils

Game 1 - Garrett Cole vs Logan Webb

The first 2 innings were scoreless. In the 3rd Estrada lead off with a single and stolen base. Freeman then singled him home for the first run of the game. In the 5th Connecticut lead off with single, single, out, 2 run single, and a Freeman home run - 5-0 Blue Devils. The Blues to this point managed only 2 singles and a walk. In the 6th inning the Blues got a 2 out walk, single, and a 2 run double by Diaz to make the score 5-2 Connecticut. In the bottom of the 8th the Blues got three singles and a E2 to score 2 runs making the score 5-4 Connecticut. Phillips came in in the 9th to get the save. Cole got the win going 5 2/3 giving up 5 hits and 2 walks. Webb got the loss going 7 giving up 13 hits and 5 walks.

In the bottom of the 6th the Blues got a hit by pitch, out, out, single, single, single scoring 2 taking the lead 3-2. In the top of the 9th Rojas leads off with a double and Estrada immediately singles him home to tie the score at 3-3. We go to extra innings. No score in the 10th, the 11th, or the 12th. Connecticut fails to score in the top of the

13th. The Blues go single, single, stolen base, walk to load the bases with no outs. Jung promptly hits a sac fly to win the game for Blue Grass - 4-3 in 13 innings. The Series is tied 1 game to 1 game. We move to Connecticut.

The Blue Devils get to Armstrong in the 2nd inning with a walk to Candelerio, a single by Naylor, a sacrifice by Erstada, and 2 run double by Taveras. Connecticut scores two more in the 5th inning. Taveras leads off with a single, McCarty got on with a fielder's choice, Freeman doubles in 1 run and Witt doubles in Freeman. 4-0 Connecticut. The Blues get on the board in the 6th. Jung leads off with a single, Lopez singles, Arozarena goes out, Friedl strikes out, Diaz singles scoring one, and Ford singles scoring one more. Now 4-2 Connecticut. In the 8th Friedl singles and Diaz walks with 1 out. Ford then gives the Blues the lead with a 3 run homer - 5-4. The Blue Devils manage only a single in the bottom of the 8th. In the 9th the Blues get a 1 out HBP, a walk, and a 3 run homer by Diaz taking an 8-4 lead that would be the final score. The Blues are up now 2 games to 1.

Connecticut ties the score in the 6th on a HBP, stolen base and a Freeman double. The Blues score 2 in the 7th on walk, single, single, wild pitch. The Blues ice the game in the 8th. After 3 singles and a walk scored a run Diaz comes up with the bases juiced and hits another of his home runs making the score 11-2. The Blue Devils get 2 in the bottom of the 9th making the final 11-4. The Blues are one win from their first World Series win 3 games to 2.

Very little hitting in this game - great pitching on both sides. Connecticut scored a run in the 3rd on a walk, stolen base, wild pitch and a sac fly. In the 7th the Blue Devils got a solo homer from Gary Sanchez to make it 2-0 Connecticut. Kelly and Kershaw were masterful through 7 innings giving up only 3 hits and 5 walks. Stewart came in to pitch in the 8th inning and gave up a HBP and a walk. Phillips came in to face Diaz. Diaz hit his 5th home run of the series to give Blue Grass a 3-2 lead going into the 9th. Fairbanks held the lead for a save and giving the Blue Grass Blues their first World Series title ever.

Many kudos to Dave and his Blue Devils, Frank and his Dreamers, Merk and his Admirals and Glen and his Bluefish (who I was fortunate enough to not have to play in the postseason). All exceptional teams. This was the fourth try for a Series title in 34(?) years in the league. So glad to finally be able to say I got one.

There is no question as to who the MVP of the Series was - Yanier Diaz. He was 11 for 24 (.458 average), hit 5 home runs, and knocked in 17 runs. Honorable mention goes to TJ Friedl who hit .391 with .500 on base and scored 6 runs (batting in front of Diaz). The pitching MVP goes to Kyle Bradish. He pitched 10 innings giving up just his first postseason run on 5 hits and 3 walks.

The postseason performance of Yanier Diaz bears a comparison to the best of all time results. In 18 games he was at bat 66 times and got 26 hits (.394 avg), 5 doubles, 9 home runs (.879 SP), and 32 RBI. Maybe not the absolute best, but very notable for sure.

This is consistent with current MLB rules. The rules for a one-game playoff in case of a tie for 5th remains the same, the game is played as the 163rd game of the season (no rest) except relievers are considered rested. Relievers are also considered rested for game 1 of the WC series even if they participated in a one game playoffs. 5.YES _____ NO _____

- 6. Change the injury chart for Netplay only. The only change would be that a 2-game injury would be for the rest of that game only, instead of that game +1.

Pitchers may only be called up from the minors to replace pitchers who are injured on a 1:1 basis.

For Written dice instructions: managers should list minor league replacements along with general (or detailed) conditions to select them. The home manager should be as logical as possible about the selection, if the instructions don't cover the roster shortfall at hand.
